AM I DYING? RESPONDING TO DIFFICULT QUESTIONS

A national audit on end of life care (IHF, 2009) revealed that staff are more comfortable discussing the person's needs with the family rather than with the person him/herself DEALING WITH DIFFICULT QUESTIONS REMEMBER Don't panic! Don't avoid the question or aim to close it down with well-meaning euphemisms or busy-ness

between low income and long hours, it is difficult to give children good life chances Research has shown that someone who has grown up in poverty is disadvantaged well into adulthood This is to a large extent because people from disadvantaged homes are less likely to get good educational qualifications

End-of-Life Care: Questions and Answers

- Be willing to reminisce about the person's life
- Avoid withholding difficult information Most patients prefer to be included in discussions about issues that concern them
- Reassure the patient that you will honor advance directives, such as living wills
- Ask if there is anything you can do
